

Shira Havkin is a PhD candidate in political sociology at the CERI (Centre d'Études et de Recherches Internationales) at Sciences-Po Paris and an assistant professor at Nanterre University (Paris X).

Her doctoral dissertation examines recent reforms in the management of Israeli border control apparatuses: the outsourcing of the military checkpoints in the Occupied Territories and the 'statization' of the asylum procedure. Her research lies at the intersection of border and migration, state redeployment and economic sociology. Within this general area, she studies the articulation of nationalism and neoliberalism in contemporary Israel.

She published several academic articles: "The Reform of Israeli Checkpoints: Outsourcing, Commodification and Redeployment of the State" (Les Études du CERI 2011), "La privatization des checkpoints: Quand l'occupation militaire rencontre le néolibéralisme" (Latte-Abdallah and Parizot (eds.) 2011, forthcoming at Ashgate, 2014). She received her Master in Philosophy at Paris 1 – Sorbonne (2008) and a B.A. in Philosophy at Tel-Aviv University (2005).
